

- 4. Knowledge & Experience Sharing


B) Capacity Building

Collaboration Platform for Greatness



Following the first annual Timeless Women's Conference 2015 themed "Heeled Heals" our 220 delegates from all over Africa and UK dialogued on the role of women in Africa's social and economic transformation and the impact of the mindset of Africa on its development.

We engaged in strategic conversations about various issues that were deemed pertinent to the flourishing of Africa's economy – issues such as

- Africa's Leadership
- Role of Media in the state of Africa
- Women the catalyst for Africa's transformation and strategies to include women at the center stage of development'
- Men's role in building bridges for women
- Education the bedrock of Africa's development
- Technology and agribusiness the future of Africa
- Women In future industries technology, construction, mining, agribusiness, oil, energy, gas, manufacturing, green industries. How can women tap into the wealth and job creation opportunities that these sectors present
- Ocliaboration for Africa's Greatness joint strategies for all countries to develop Africa's potential. Strategic partnerships between governments, public, private, development and social sectors

TIMELESS WOMEN'S CONFERENCE 2015

Conference Outcomes

Following the outcomes of the conference, through the TWOW (Timeless Women of Wonder Foundation), our partners both in public sector and private sector together with technical experts embarked to fulfill the promise – to do what we seed needed to be done. SOME of the strong recommendations and strategies that came out of one of the sessions "WOMEN IN FUTURE INDUSTRIES include:

- 1. Building the skills and capacities of women in the construction sector to empower them to take up wealth and job creation opportunities in this growing sector.
- 2. To actualize the potential of women by exposing them to new opportunities in this sector
- 3. To fulfill the call to collaborate as a strategy for greatness, efficiency and impact
- 4. To ensure that true impact is actualized by ensuring that the women who are trained have jobs or business within the sector.
- 5. To train women with skills that they can use to change their personal circumstances and environment in turn transforming their communities.

After the Timeless Women's Conference 2015 themed "Healed Heels" we compiled all the outcomes from all our sessions to inform our key strategic areas for Timeless Women in Africa and the basis of our initiatives.


3 months after the February conference (June 2015), We formed teams and strategic partnerships to implement the key strategies one of which focused on Skills development for women in the construction sector.

Through interactions with women leaders at the grass roots, we identified one of the largest slums in east and central Africa – KIBERA Slums and inspired the women on the ground to try something new. This was about the hardest hurdle we needed to overcome.

They had a low level of trust for us, they were used to handouts and free giveaways, they had a low level of self-confidence and a high sense of hopelessness – it was hard for them to understand us when we said – "We are not here to give you fish but to teach you how to catch fish that will last all your life and pass on to the next generation" – well, almost 80% of the women left. We were left with about 320 women who decided to give this plan a try.





THE NEXT STEP

Jobs and Business Opportunities

We begun the series of training sessions, first of all dealing with mindsets and self, then moving onto technical sessions in which each woman chose her area of interest. We themed the project – Unveiling her Star – for in these women was great potential waiting to be unlocked. Opportunities to embrace Future industries – construction.

Through working with our key partners – Christian Aid / UK and the National Construction Authority we worked with several other partners like Savannah cement, Mabati Rolling Mills, Rexe Roofing, Crown Paints Ltd, Basco Paints Ltd and many technical experts in the field to train 320 women in various fields of construction. We culminated the training session for the first cohort of Women on the 4th Dec 2015, just 5 months after its inception.

320 women graduated in both Theory and Practical / Technical in various disciplines of construction and received various accreditation from TWOW and National Construction Authority which is a government institution that empowers them with certification that enables the women to get jobs anywhere in the country in their field of accreditation.

The next step and commitment is to continue working with our partners and the government to assimilate these women in the sector through jobs and business opportunities.











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
